5 Free Tips and Tricks in Photoshop Elements Save for Web Save for Web (Windows) is found in the File menu on Windows platforms. This is the simplest way to save your images for the web, but it does require some computer skills, like the commands to copy and paste images into the web directory. If you want to take your expertise to the next level, read up on FTP and it will give you a few more options of using the command Prompt. But if you're new to the computer, it's not necessary and too much to learn at once. Use your Camera If you don't have a digital camera, start with your camera. The photo is automatically saved to your computer in a JPEG format. JPEGs are much smaller than RAW or TIFF format images and are easiest to upload to websites. This is also the quickest way to print out and share your photos on social media. Saving an image in RAW or TIFF format takes a bit longer to download to your computer. RAW or TIFF formats are best for printing. You also have a lot of control over your image after you've saved it. Also read up on the best camera settings in photography. Understand Your Image When you're designing images, there are several aspects that will determine how your images look on the web. Here are some popular tips to make your images look their best: Resolution "Resolution" is the measurement of what your photo will look like when you "zoom in" on a computer screen. The higher the resolution, the larger and clearer the image will appear on your screen. For web purposes, resolution is measured in pixels. A pixel is the smallest unit of computer graphics. Each pixel is about the size of a period at the end of a sentence. This means that, if you had a resolution of 5,000 pixels, each line of text would be one pixel on the page. Unless you have a photo printed on an enormous canvas, the resolution is probably less than 1,000 pixels. When you see "100%" in your image, this is the resolution you're looking at. When designing your images, you're looking at 1,280 x 720 pixel resolution. An easy way to resize an image is to use the Zoom tool. First, open your image in Photoshop 05a79cecff

Looney Tunes - #78 Released It's another tail! Hi there, First of all, I'd like to thank you for being one of the 6,464,000 consumers who have received a copy of Looney Tunes #78 as part of the upcoming Topps release. This issue is special to me, as it includes an assortment of character cards that represent some of my favorite characters from the Warner Bros. stable of shorts. Many of these cards are the same as those in the recent Warner Bros. Animation #102 release, but they're stickered with their "Looney Tunes" logo. Topps had already produced a slate of character cards for the long-running Looney Tunes product line (you can find some examples on my booth wall), and these characters appeared on the same cards (especially in the graded-card product). This time around, they're stickered with the "Looney Tunes" logo, which was unique, since the old Topps product used the "cartoon" logo. The effect is similar to the comic book product, where the product might say "Superman" or "Superboy", and the cover might be black with red lettering or white with black lettering. One thing that I didn't see in the #102 release is the color-by-number cards. I'm pretty sure I've got a bunch more, but I'm not sure I've put them on the market yet, so I won't mention the numbers. I also haven't seen the card backs, which probably will show up as I add more to the product. The characters in this assortment include:

- Slimer - The slimy fiend from the Ghostbusters film, who can apparently chew his way through any type of atmosphere.
- Wile E. Coyote - The master of misdirection.
- Speedy Gonzales - A feline guy, known as the fastest cat in the West.
- Tweety - The extremely animated bird, who has had one of the most recognizable laugh-tracks in movie history. He's not usually the type of character who'd have a comic book featuring him, but these cards bring him to the attention of our children.
- Moondust - The best of a trio of polka-dotted birds, one of whom (below) is also known as Doodle.
- Tweety's nephew, Tomcat - Perhaps the least-know

What's New in the?

It was part of a successful scoring run in Sweden that saw her make her NHL debut and become the youngest player to appear in a Stanley Cup Final. She also brought a smile to Portland fan's faces while holding a cup during the team's first home win since 2004. If the Portland Winter Hawks were happy for Silfverberg, her parents were happy for her as well. The Winterhawks ended their playoff drought with a 3-0 series win over the Spokane Chiefs Wednesday, part of her first experience as a champion. Later, she joined teammates and others in the Lloyd Center Plaza to take part in a cheering "Let's Go Hawks!" chant. The chant is the Hawks' first since before the Stanley Cup final. "It's been pretty crazy," said Silfverberg, who became the Hawks' first Swedish-born player since Mikaela "Miki" Granlund's rookie season. "It's been really exciting, but it hasn't really sunk in yet. I'm still kind of processing it all." The Hawks had to wait nearly six months to become the first team to reach the Cup Final after being eliminated in the first round three times in the six years prior. "It's been a long time coming," Silfverberg said. "I'm proud of this team because they worked hard. Now we're in the Cup Final. It's a dream come true." Silfverberg scored the final three goals in Portland's run to the Final. In the series against Spokane, she contributed two goals in the first-round victory and one more in Game 2, including the game-winner in a 4-1 win in Game 4. The third game she scored four times to help the Hawks win 5-3. "It's very exciting. I'm just so happy and proud of all of the girls," she said of the Hawks' run. "It's a great feeling and it's such an amazing feeling that I'm part of. It's amazing." The way the Hawks played in the series, Silfverberg was confident the Hawks would advance to the Western Conference finals. "I'm just happy that we had a good run and all the time we needed to get here," she said. "I think I'm just happy that we played good hockey all the time, really hard." During the series against the Chiefs, Silfverberg was paired with defenseman Emily
